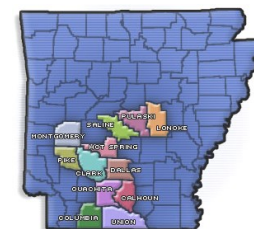

## Food Assistance

CADC helps families achieve their greatest potential through USDA Commodities. The program helps promote greater family stability in low wealth homes and provides a safety net for persons who are facing hunger. Food assistance and educational programs are provided.



## Types of Services

CADC provides the quarterly USDA Commodity (TEFAP or The Emergency Food Assistance Program), the monthly USDA Supplemental Food Program (CSFP), and the Summer Food Service Programs (SFSP). Each program works to improve the health and nutritional needs of our most vulnerable populations: low wealth, elderly, and children and youth from low wealth families.

## Commodity Services



### TEFAP

CADC distributes surplus food on a quarterly basis to income eligible recipients. Sites are located in each of our 12 counties. Call 501-778-1133 for more information.

### CSFP

Income eligible persons ages 60 and older may participate in the monthly supplemental food program in Saline, Hot Spring, Pike, Clark and Montgomery counties. New participants may be added to a waiting list. Contact your local senior center or call CADC for more information. CSFP participants may not receive quarterly food distributions.

### Summer Food Service Programs

During the summer, children in low-wealth families have limited resources for well-balanced meals throughout the day. CADC administers the summer food service program to help alleviate hunger among youth during the summer months. Call 501-332-5426 for more information.

## Eligibility

To be eligible for commodities, current income guidelines must be met, which is 130% of federal poverty guidelines. Other guidelines may apply.

**There is no cost to participate in commodities if your household qualifies for the service. All TEFAP and CSFP participants must present photo identification.**
