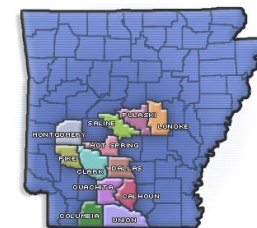

What is Head Start?

The CADC Head Start program was started in 1967 to give children from low-income families a head start before they enter elementary school.

The main focus is to increase the school readiness of young children ages 3 and 4. The program also seeks to help parents and caregivers be empowered to self sufficiency.



Head Start's services include early reading and writing, kindergarten readiness, health and nutrition screening, vision and hearing screening, nutritious meals and snacks, disabilities services and family services. While CADC does not provide transportation services, it will assist families in seeking public transportation.

Eligibility Requirements

- ◆ Child must be 3 or 4 years old
- ◆ Family must live within the county
- ◆ Family must meet federal income guidelines



About CADC's Head Start Program

- ★ CADC operates 15 total funded Head Start centers
- ★ Helps children grow educationally, socially, physically, and emotionally
- ★ Helps parents obtain needed services for their families
- ★ Enriches parent's relationship with their child
- ★ Provides medical, dental, vision, and hearing screenings for children
- ★ Offers a chance for children to learn, play, and grow with other children
- ★ Social service help and referrals for children and families
